Accommodation (bed and breakfast) from Thursday 14th September 2006 to Sunday 17th September 2006 at the riders own expense. (Riders wishing to obtain preferential rates should book their accommodation through the O.C.)

Riders meals (lunch) from Friday 15th September 2006 to Sunday 17th September 2006 inclusive will be available on the showground at the OCs expense.

B) Grooms

Requests for accommodation must be sent with entries.

Cost of accommodation (one groom per rider) will be at the cost of the individual rider.

Adequate sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC and will be available on the showground from 12 noon on Wednesday 13th September 2006 until 12 noon on Tuesday 19th September 2006.

C) Horses

All transport costs to and from the event will be the responsibility of the individual rider.

D) Welcome

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC no later than two weeks prior to the event in order to ensure their arrival is facilitated.

Horses will be accepted into the event stables from 12 noon on Wednesday 13th September 2006 onwards. All stables must be vacated by 12 noon on Tuesday 19th September 2006.

E) Local Transportation – Arrangements from Hotel to Showground

Courtesy transport will be provided between the shows preferred hotels in (Kocevje) and the showground. This will operate from 12 noon on Thursday 14th September 2006 until 12 noon on Monday 18th September 2006.

F) Advertising and Publicity on Competitors and Horses

FEI General Regulations Article 136 will apply in all national and international classes.

The show will permit logos in accordance with Article 136.

The Chief Steward is responsible for ensuring that FEI Regulations relating to Art. 136 are respected by riders before entering the arena. Competitors not complying with Art. 136 will not be permitted to enter the arena during the competition.

Please note, under no circumstances will any Veterinary Surgeon, other than the Veterinary Commission appointed by the OC, be allowed to treat any horse at the show, unless permission has been received from the Veterinary Commission. In the event that such permission is granted, the Veterinary Surgeon will be accompanied by a member of the Veterinary Commission (FEI Veterinary Delegate).

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules and **WILL APPLY EQUALLY TO ALL HORSES ENTERED IN NATIONAL COMPETITIONS.**

"General Regulations", 21st Edition, effective 1st January 2005:

Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country, and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS continued.

Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. APPENDIX VI

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

VIII MISCELLANEOUS

1. Objections / Complaints

OBJECTIONS. In all national and international competitions objections must be made in writing in accordance with Article 170 - 171 of the FEI General Regulations and accompanied by a deposit of € 100.00 (150CHF) in cash. Exchange Rate at 1.6 valid as of the date of the signed off schedule. The declaration upon any decision of the Appeal Committee who determine the Objection shall be final and binding and the Objector shall, by lodging the objection, be taken to agree that such a decision shall be final and binding upon him, and that no appeal there from shall lie upon any ground whatever. If the objection shall be determined against the Objector he shall also be liable to the event for the amount of costs and expenses occasioned by the objection and the determination thereof, unless in the opinion of the appeal committee who determined the objection there existed good and reasonable ground for the objection when they may order to the contrary.

2. Prize - Giving Ceremony

At least, the eight highest placed riders in each competition will be required to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony for that competition. This will be confirmed by the competitor information system during each competition. All Prize Winners to attend.

3. Deductions from Prize Money

Deductions from prize money including government taxes will be made in accordance with Slovenian/EU law. All participants will be provided with an official form showing details of these deductions.

4. Distribution of Prize Money & Indemnities

All prize money will be paid by cheque in euros after completion of the last competition on Sunday 17th September 2006. Please see Appendix for details

6. **Insurances**

The Owner of any horse which shall cause or occasion any damage or injury whatever shall indemnify and hold harmless the Organisers from and against all legal proceedings, actions, expenses, costs, claims, demands or damages whatsoever arising from any accident or other incident which may occur, and repair any injury which may be so occasioned. Each owner shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal exhibited by him, and for the description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify and hold harmless CSI-W Ugar 2006 in respect thereof as aforesaid.

Neither the event or any of its officers or servants shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that might happen from any cause or circumstances whatsoever to any persons, or Owners, or their servants, or to any animal or article exhibited, or property brought into the showground and its adjoining areas including the stable area and all car parks, or otherwise for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to the show in relation thereto. Every owner must have at least one servant (person responsible) in charge of the horse or horses or property exhibited by him.

Vehicles are permitted on the showground, car and horse box parks but only at the owners own risk. No responsibility is accepted for cars or other vehicles and/or their contents left in the Official Car park, or elsewhere, before, during or after the event, at any time.

The Event, the Organisers their respective Officers, Servants or Agents shall have no liability for any injury, loss or damage whatsoever and howsoever caused to or suffered by the Competitors, Exhibitors, Invitees or Spectators, their property, servants, agents, horses or other animals. Each Competitor, Exhibitor and Invitee shall indemnify and save harmless the Organisers in respect of any damage or injury of whatever nature and howsoever occasioned to any person or property by any such Competitor or Exhibitor or any horse or other animal which he or she brings or is responsible for bringing to or upon the premises of the Organisers.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. It is a condition of entry that all owners are in possession of valid third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

7. **EVENT'S ORGANISATION**

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Ground Jury, the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances.

Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible.

8. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

Each competitor will be issued with the following accreditation:

1. Rider
2. Rider's Partner
3. Owner x 2 per horse
4. Groom

All competitors, owners, grooms and other relevant persons must display their passes at all times, otherwise entry will be refused.

All horses competing at the event must be stabled on the showground and are not to be removed between the dates of 14th September and the last competition on Sunday 17th September.

All horses will be issued with a bridle number on arrival at the event. This numbers must be clearly displayed on the horse at all times when it is out of the stable during its stay at the event.

In addition, all competitors (or person responsible) will be issued with one Emergency Contact Stable Card (ECSC) for each horse upon arrival. This card must be completed and attached to the horses stable door. In the event that a horse is found to require treatment and the competitor/person responsible cannot be contacted, the treating veterinarian will treat the horse as he/she sees fit.

The Organisers reserve the right to remove any horse, Owner or servant (person responsible) from the event, or to refuse admission without being required to assign any reason or being liable for compensation.

Additional accreditation can be purchased upon approval by the OC for € 100.00. This charge will also apply to accreditation lost or stolen that is replaced.

All participants must check in at the Accreditations Office immediately upon arrival at the showground.

9. Schooling During Competitions

Riders wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These riders will start first in these competitions.

10. Safety Cups

11. Start Lists & Results Sheets

The name of the owner of each horse will be added to all start / result sheets as well as its stud book initials, country of birth, sex and age.

12. Disputes

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

13. Dress/Headgear

Competitors attention is drawn to FEI Article 256.1.4:

It is compulsory for anyone jumping a horse to wear a properly fastened hard hat with three point retention harness, including members of the armed services, police, gendarmerie, members of military establishments and national studs.

This is strongly recommended also for anyone working a horse in the exercise and schooling areas or anywhere on the showground.

14. Image Rights

It is a condition of entry that all competitors and the owners of their horses will permit any photographic or filmed material derived during the course of the event, to be used subsequently by the Organisers for future promotion of their business interests, or the show at no cost to the latter.

17. Health & Safety

All participants and visitors to the event must agree to observe and adhere to any and all health and safety policies or instructions issued to them by the organisers of the event. These will be displayed in both the Stable Manager's Office, the Organiser's Office and at all points of entry to the event site.

The following at least will apply:

- i) The organiser has the overall responsibility for Health and Safety.
- ii) The event is organised in accordance with Health and Safety legislation and all who have, to any extent, control of the premises or site at which the event takes place are responsible for ensuring that:
 - a) Everything reasonably practical is done to ensure the health, safety and welfare of those attending the event.
 - b) They conduct themselves in such a manner so as not to put themselves or anyone else at risk.
 - c) Access to and egress from the site is safe.

Members of the public, competitors and grooms are equally responsible for ensuring that they do not put other persons at risk and that they co-operate with the organisers in compliance with all Health & Safety legislation.

- iii) Emergency Access – in the case of an emergency, the emergency services must have un-restricted access to all areas of the event site at all times. To that end, all participants and visitors to the event must ensure that vehicles are only parked in designated areas and at no time obstruct access to any part of the site.
- iv) Horses – horses can be easily frightened and can be dangerous. Members of the public will be requested to keep clear of equine areas and to avoid behaviour that might alarm horses, however competitors and grooms are also requested not to take horses into public areas and to remain in the areas (arenas, warm-up areas, horsewalks and stables) designated for equine activity.
- v) Children – children, be they accompanied by participants or visitors to the event must be supervised by parents/guardians at all times.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise
